## Additional Information

**All travelers must have a valid Chinese Visa.** Campbell County Chamber of Commerce will handle Visa applications at a cost of \$145 per person—submitted no later than June 1.

**\*The trip cost of \$1,999 per person is based on double occupancy.** A single room in all cities will cost an additional \$450. An upgrade to a business class seat on the round-trip flight will cost an additional \$4,500.

**Travelers will find very few ATM machines on the trip;** however, travelers checks and credit cards are accepted in most locations. At the beginning of the trip you are asked to tip \$25 for the entire trip. It is recommended that you take small denominations of cash in case you decide to purchase anything.

**Reservation deadline is July 1.** A \$250 non-refundable deposit is required at time of reservation. **Full payment is due August 1.**

## Itinerary

### Day 1, October 12, Los Angeles to Beijing

Board a charter bus in the morning and travel to Los Angeles International Airport for an afternoon flight to Beijing. Cross the International Dateline.

### Day 2 Beijing

After a short layover in Shanghai, arrive in Beijing, the capital of China, and meet the tour guide at the airport. Hotel transfer.

### Day 3 Beijing

In the morning, visit the Temple of Heaven, built in 1420 A.D., where the emperors prayed to the heaven for a good harvest. Take a tour bus excursion to the Great Wall, a 2,000 year old and 4,000-mile long construction that is said to be the only man-made structure visible from the moon. En-route, visit the Jade Factory. Afterward, tour the Ming Dynasty Tombs, where 13 emperors are entombed—one crypt is excavated and open for exploration. End the day with a Chinese Acrobatic Show.

### Day 4 Beijing

Enjoy sightseeing excursions to Tian An Men Square, the largest square in the world; Palace Museum (aka, Forbidden City) home of 24 emperors from the Ming Dynasty through the Qing Dynasty; Pearl Market, best known for its unique variety of pearls; Summer Palace, enjoy the Long Corridor and painted gallery, Kunming Lake, Longevity Hill, 17-Arch Bridge and Marble Boat. End the day with a Peking roast duck dinner.

### Day 5 Shanghai and Suzhou

Take a morning flight to Shanghai, then a short bus trip to Suzhou. Afternoon sightseeing trip at Tiger Hill, a hill named for its resemblance to a crouching tiger.

### Day 6 Suzhou to Hangzhou

Enjoy a morning visit to the Suzhou Silk Factory and the renowned classical Chinese Lingering Garden. In the afternoon, visit the National Embroidery Institute to see silk embroidery, a Chinese craft steeped in 1000 years of history. Enjoy a chartered bus trip to the Economic Development Zone in Hangzhou.

### Day 7 Hangzhou to Shanghai

Start the day with a relaxing boat cruise on West Lake and stop at the jewel-like pagodas. Afterward, enjoy tours to the Long Jing Tea Plantation, home to China's most famous tea; and Lingyin Temple, a Buddhist temple with a 64.3-foot camphor wood-carved Buddha. Continue on bus to Shanghai.

### Day 8 Shanghai

The day begins at the Bund, a famous waterfront park, followed by a tour of the Shanghai Silk Rug Factory. In the afternoon, take in the sights of the Yu Garden, a maze of marvelous pavilions, ponds, rocky works and over arching trees. Travelers will enjoy some free time exploring the many crafts of the old-town bazaar. Afterward, visit the Pudong Economic Development Zone and enter the 2010 World Expo.

### Day 9, October 20, Shanghai to Los Angeles

Depart for Los Angeles in the afternoon.
